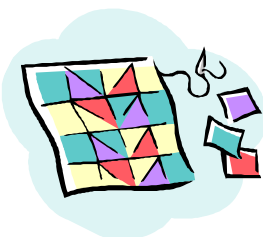

St. Olaf Church Has a New Gallery Wall



While everyone has been enjoying the fine amenities of our new and remodeled building, something has been missing. Until now, that is. Remember the special displays there used to be in the Murray Room? Well, the recent completion of the gallery display area on the north side of the new narthex means that we can get back to showcasing some of the works of our talented members.

The creation of this display area has been a project of the Gallery Wall Ministry team (part of the Older Adult Ministry team) consisting of Todd Portinga, Russ Wangen, Bruce Loeschen and Yvonne Jondal.

Thanks to a gift from the St. Olaf Foundation and from memorial funds received, the team was able to engage the services of the talented woodworker, Dale Akkerman, to design and create the customized display case and wall-mount area. Keith Barnes, Rich Chuick, and Glenn Bakke also assisted. The team's work may not be done yet as they are also considering adding track lighting in the gallery area.

According to Todd, the mission of the Older Adult Ministry team is to "give vision and value to the ministry of older adults" and to "re-vision how we view older members of our congregation as resources of faith." One aspect of these resources is their creativity, often exemplified through arts and crafts. Yet, while this project comes from this ministry team, the displays will not be limited to older adults only.

Plans are to change the display every two months, with the March and April display focusing on various forms of the cross. For this showcase, congregation members are invited to share crosses which they have made or own, or even striking photos of crosses. SEASON OF LENT BEGINS ON FEBRUARY 22



"Ash Wednesday is the traditional beginning of Lent which is a 40-day liturgical season that concludes at Easter. Lent is often associated with the disciplines of fasting, charity and prayer. Lent is intended to be a time of reflection, a time to meditate on our lives.

The name *Ash Wednesday* comes from the practice of placing ashes on the forehead in the shape of a cross. Ashes are referred to in the Old Testament as signs of sorrow, mourning, humility, repentance, and mortality; "You are dust, and to dust you shall return." (Genesis 3:19)" (Excerpts from an early article written by Todd Portinga.)

Ash Wednesday worship services, which will include the Sacrament of Holy Communion and the imposition of ashes, will be offered at 12:00, 4:15 and 6:15 p.m. (Please note the time change for the last worship service). A chili supper will be served by the youth from 4:45 to 6:00 p.m. Beginning on Wednesday, February 29, there will be two worship opportunities, at 4:15 and 6:15 p.m., with a light Lenten Supper served between them.

FEBRUARY KIT-OF-THE-MONTH: SCHOOL KITS

LWR SCHOOL KITS

Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college-ruled paper approximately 8 x 10 1/2 “, no loose-leaf paper
 One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
 One pencil sharpener
 One 2 1/2 inch eraser
 One blunt scissors (safety scissors with steel blades work well)
 Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers: secure together with a rubber band
 Five ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
 One box of 16 or 24 crayons
 One sturdy drawstring backpack - cloth bag approximately 14” x 17” with shoulder straps (NO standard backpacks); recommended fabrics include heavy cotton, canvas, denim and twill. (Copies of the Drawstring School Kit Bag pattern are available in the church office along with the information on the kits.)

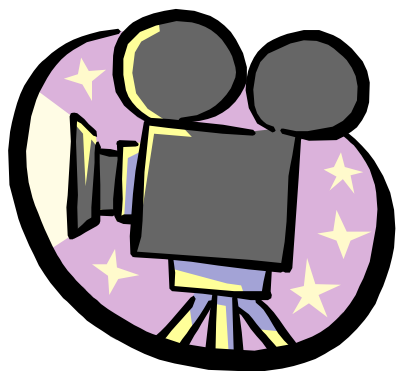
Bring in items for the kit-of-the-month and put them in the plastic bins in the narthex. Whatever is received will be assembled into completed kits to be sent to LWR in May. Items listed above are the only items that will be accepted. All items must be new and in condition. Remove any excess packaging, pack all items in bag and close. Do not enclose the kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

WHEN: Sundays 5:00 to approximately 7:30 p.m.

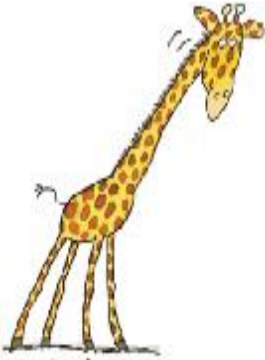
WHERE: Sunken Auditorium in Basement (Bring your favorite pillow and blanket!)

Regular Council Meeting
January 10, 2012

Present: John Carroll, Kathy Glowac, Carolyn Eilertson, Lois Peters, Nicole Cizik, Connie Simonson, DeeDee Marx, Dave Sylte, Scott Weber, Mike Guanella, and Neal Hull.

The meeting was called to order by President John Carroll. Carolyn Eilertson led the group in devotions.

Action Items

A request from Bridget's Dance Studio was presented, requesting use of St. Olaf's gym space for sessions on four Thursdays from Feb. 16 to Mar. 8. A motion was made by Dave, seconded by Nicole to approve the request. After further discussion about the fee to be charged, a motion was made by Dave, seconded by Nicole to amend the motion to include a total charge of \$100 for the four sessions. The amendment to the motion carried. The original motion as amended also passed.

In the matter of council appointees to the nominating committee, Dave made a motion, seconded by Lois, to have Connie and Nicole serve on the committee. Motion carried.

Discussion Items

Neal Hull gave an update about the Paint-the-City Pink event on Feb. 5. (This is a cancer awareness event.) He and Sharon Alms are coordinating a pancake and spam breakfast at St. Olaf from 8 to 1 that day. All costs for that event will be borne by the Hormel Institute and profits will go to them for research. The Reaching Board was charged with the task of doing some outreach that day as there will be non-members attending the event.

The Boards were reminded that their reports for the church's annual report are due in the office by Jan. 20th.

The council will be presenting the ACE class at 9:15 on January 22 to review the past year as well as the proposed 2012 budget.

The annual meeting will be Jan. 29 at 1:30 following a dinner which will be served by the youth group.

Secretary's report

A motion was made by Connie, seconded by Kathy to approve the minutes of the last council meeting. Motion carried.

Financial Report

Eric informed the council that his report for the month of December and for 2011 is not yet complete. He noted that the general fund has changed from a negative \$70,000 in mid-2010 to about even as of the end of the year. Even though he did not have precise figures, he feels that the estimate of giving for 2012 will run about the same as 2011. The Foundation's challenge for the Capital Appeal has been met, so they will be adding \$7,500 to be paid on the principal balance.

Board Reports

Reaching—Scott reported that he will be attending the conference in Houston TX in February with Simon Bol Top and Gatlaug Puk.

Welcoming—DeeDee reported that Nicole Caporale and Carla Conrard are the coordinators for the church nursery. Lois stated that the volunteers for the re-activated Building and Grounds team will be meeting on Monday, Jan. 16 to organize their efforts.

Growing—Connie reported that the process of finding mentors for the 6th graders is underway. She stated that Ashley will be doing a survey regarding Vacation Bible School to determine the best time to offer it. Jill Medgaarden and Ashley Corbett will be the new music leaders for Sunday School.

Caring—Dave reported that work is continuing on their projects, the Continuing Ed event, tutoring, and contacts with inactives. He also noted that the meeting of the Older Adult Ministry team will be Jan. 26 at 8:30 a.m.

Staff Reports

Eric reported that Arens has begun work on the heating and air conditioning system. Software updates have been made in the office. He also informed the group that due to legislative changes, churches no longer are required to have a license for their kitchens. St. Olaf has already paid the annual license fee of \$794 but will be seeking a refund.

Todd will be in Albuquerque for a week of continuing ed.

The meeting adjourned and closed with the Lord's Prayer.

2012—2013 WEE LEARNING CENTER REGISTRATION SET TO BEGIN

Preregistration for the 2012-2013 school year will begin on Monday, February 20 for all current Wee Learning Center families. Whether the current student is advancing into the next classroom or a sibling will be entering the program in September, this is the week in February that is reserved just for them. Pre-registration for van transportation will begin on the 20th as well.

Beginning on Sunday, February 26, registration is opened up to families of the St. Olaf congregation. There will be a special registration time beginning between 9 and 11:00 a.m. on Sunday and continuing throughout the week. Van preregistration will be held during this time as well. Students must be at least 3 years old on September 1, 2012 to enroll at the Wee Learning Center.

Community Registration will begin on March 3 at 9:00 a.m. and will continue until all 80 slots have been filled. Remaining van slots will be offered at this time.

PENNY COLLECTION CONTINUES AT WEE LEARNING



During the first six weeks of penny collections, the Wee Learning Center collected more than 8800 pennies! This money will provide Spammy™ (a shelf-stable fortified turkey spread) to an orphanage plus an additional family in Guatemala for one month. Their goal is to feed the orphanage and the family for an entire year which means 105,600 pennies need to be collected by May 15. The children are confident they will reach their goal! (Be watching for a penny count update in March!) Why are the students participating in the project? The Wee Learning Center staff believes it is important that children learn about giving. As Jesus taught in Matthew 25:45 ... "I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me." Children in Guatemala are certainly some of the "least of these"... the rate of chronic child malnutrition in Guatemala is higher than many countries in Africa with more than 75 percent of the people living in poverty! Our students will continue to do for them; one penny at a time.
